this is the first in depth study of the science fiction television devised and written by terry nation terry nation was the inventor of the daleks and wrote other serials for doctor who he also wrote the bbc s 1970s post apocalyptic drama survivors and created the space adventure series blake s 7 previously television science fiction in britain has received little critical attention this book fills that gap and places nation s work in the context of its production using terry nation s science fiction work as a case study the boundaries around the authorship and authority of the television writer are explored in detail the authors make use of bbc s archival research and specially conducted interviews with television producers and other production staff to discuss how the programmes that terry nation created and wrote were commissioned produced and brought to the screen the book makes an important contribution to the study of british television history and will be of interest to enthusiasts of terry nation s landmark drama series as well as students of television studies

the end of the world may be upon us but it certainly is taking its sweet time playing out the walkers on the walking dead have been walking for nearly a decade there are now dozens of apocalyptic television shows and we use the end times to describe everything from domestic politics and international conflict to the weather and our views of the future this collection of new essays asks what it means to live in a world inundated with representations of the apocalypse focusing on such series as the walking dead the strain battlestar galactica doomsday preppers westworld the handmaid s tale they explore how the serialization of the end of the world allows for a closer examination of the disintegration of humanity while it happens do these shows prepare us for what is to come do they spur us to action might they even be causing the apocalypse

the daleks are one of the most iconic and fearsome creations in television history since their first appearance in 1963 they have simultaneously fascinated and terrified generations of children their instant success ensuring and sometimes eclipsing that of doctor who they sprang from the imagination of terry nation a failed stand up comic who became one of the most prolific writers for television that britain ever produced survivors his vision of a post apocalyptic england so haunted audiences in the seventies that the bbc revived it over thirty years on and blake s 7 constantly rumored for return endures as a cult sci fi classic but it is for his genocidal pepperpots that nation is most often remembered and on the 50th anniversary of their creation they continue to top the saturday night ratings yet while the daleks brought him notoriety and riches nation played a much wider role in british broadcasting s golden age he wrote for spike milligan frankie howerd and an increasingly troubled tony hancock and as one of the key figures behind the adventure series of the sixties including the avengers the saint and the persuaders he turned the pulp classics of his boyhood into a major british export in the man who invented the daleks acclaimed cultural historian alwyn w turner explores the curious and contested origins of doctor who s greatest villains and sheds light on a strange world of ambitious young writers producers and performers without whom british culture today would look very different

although it started as a british television show with a small but devoted fan base doctor who has grown in popularity and now appeals to audiences around the world in the fifty year history of the program doctor who s producers and scriptwriters have drawn on a dizzying array of literary sources and inspirations elements from homer classic literature gothic horror swashbucklers jacobean revenge tragedies orwellian dystopias westerns and the novels of agatha christie and evelyn waugh have all been woven into the fabric of the series one famous storyline from the mid 1970s was rooted in the victoriana of authors like h rider haggard and arthur conan doyle
